ENCOMPASS: RESOURCES FOR LEARNING



456 students participated in our summer learning and enrichment programs. 75% did not experience "summer slide" and 91% made social-emotional gains. They've returned to schools throughout the City of Rochester ready for learning.



In partnership with 14 schools, this year, we will provide school day and afterschool academic programs for 2,752 students.



Together with families, we continue to roll out our groundbreaking, holistic approach -Family Navigation- which integrates personalized education, health and social service supports. So far, we have worked with 35 families.



Our Neighborhood Arts students are *growing* academic skills and food literacy through enriching experiences in our MyPlate teaching garden. It's the first of it's kind in Rochester!



THE NORMAN HOWARD SCHOOL
